Foreword by Alex Handke

Member of the Board of Directors

I came across the work of Hadia Medical Swiss by chance. I am a trained chemical engineer and have many years of experience in plant construction and the operation of chemical plants. For the last 10 years before my retirement, I worked as a chemical defence officer and chief of staff for a large professional fire brigade. Hadia asked me if I could develop a concept for the fire brigade in Hargeisa, the capital of Somaliland.

During my first visit to Somaliland, I was able to gain a good overview of Hadia's work. I was deeply impressed by the direct assistance provided on site and the warm contact with the people. When I was later asked to make my engineering knowledge available to Hadia, I gladly accepted. I have always been interested in travelling to distant countries. Somaliland is a country in transition, with many projects for the development of the country in the pipeline and many opportunities for cooperation open and in demand.

My work for Hadia involves water supply, wastewater treatment, power supply and waste management in the hospitals we support. As Somaliland enjoys long hours of sunshine and is mostly windy, electricity is generated using solar cells and wind turbines. A water supply network is currently only being set up in the capital, Hargeisa. Normally, water is transported to consumers by tanker trucks from boreholes or rainwater collection basins.

We have developed and implemented the following solution for the hospital in Salahley that we are currently supporting:

The water is pumped to the surface from a borehole 240 metres deep and transported to the hospital in the hospital's own tanker truck, where it is temporarily stored in two large tanks. From these tanks, the water is fed into a desalination plant and then transported to two tanks for drinking water. From there, it is piped to the individual consumers. The electrical energy for the hospital and the water supply is generated by solar cells, which we have installed as sun protection above the water storage tanks. Bashir Subaan supports me in my work on site as an assistant and translator, without whose competent help I would not be able to implement anything in Somaliland.

Previously, the hospital collected its water during rainfall from the hospital roof and from a rainwater collection basin. This water was heavily contaminated with bacteria and could only be used safely after boiling. The new water supply has now made a significant contribution to the qualified operation of the hospital in Salahley. The active use of the medical services confirms the success of our work in Somaliland.

Activities during the reporting year

At the beginning of the year, new sanitary facilities were installed at Edna Adan University Hospital, and in autumn, USB conducted training courses there for the last time. This marks the end of our work at this hospital. The medical student we supported has successfully passed his exams. Similarly, a member of Hadia with diplomatic experience from previous work at the FDFA is advising the Somaliland Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The medical project in Salahley got off to a flying start when Hadia, AN-NYA and EDO reope-ned the hospital in Salahley in January 2025 in the presence of four ministers. From the outset, the influx of patients was greater than expected, with 100 to 120 patients arriving every day. So far, 13 life-saving operations have been performed. Another great success was a spontaneous vaginal delivery of triplets. The government has employed three doctors in Salahley, who are supplemented once a week by a team of specialists. The government is also expanding the infrastructure in Salahley.

To mark the opening, a team from AN-NYA operated and trained in Salahley and at the children's hospital in Hargeisa. AN-NYA undertook a second similar mission in the autumn.

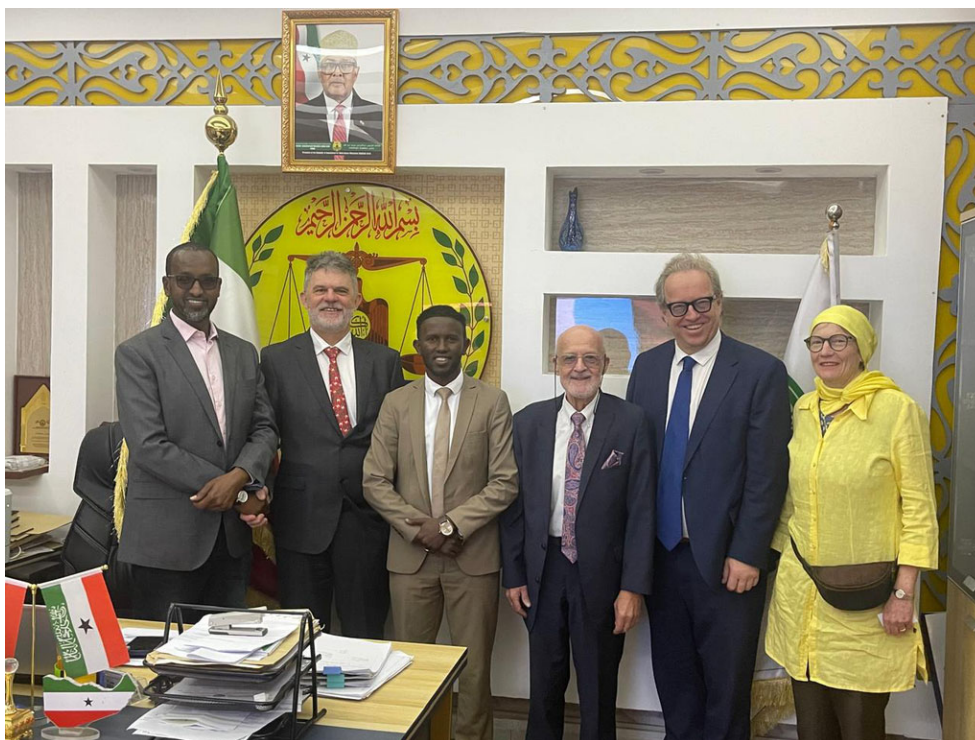


Opening ceremony in Salahley

Conceptual development

The health of the population in Salahley improved, but many people from nearby Balimataan arrived in poor condition, with particularly alarming blood values.

At a workshop in early April, we analysed this and decided not to take any further expansion steps in the reporting year, but rather to stabilise the current situation and collect data for needs-based further development. The initial results were not conclusive, so we worked together to create Excel spreadsheets to improve data collection. Practical implementation is the responsibility of the running board appointed by the government. The EDO also has a seat on this board.



In the Ministry of Health (MoHD)

EDO and Hadia agree that the health and nutrition situation in Salahley and Balimataan should not be addressed in isolation, but rather that the area should be viewed and developed as a larger entity. This requires an integrated Global Health concept for the entire region.

Hadia and EDO presented this idea to the Ministry of Health, business leaders and local representatives in December. It was well received. Somaliland wants to start with the newly developed Excel spreadsheets and then move on to Panda, a computer system with antenatal and postnatal app. Hadia wants to play a major role in financing Panda and will take on the training system with antenatal and post of users as part of its introduction. It is encouraging that the dual training pro-programme also met with great interest.

The basic features of the Global Health Concept are to be developed at a workshop in Basel at the beginning of April. The EDO's senior management will also take part in this.

Report of the statutory auditor on the limited statutory examination in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER

As statutory auditor, we have examined the financial statements (comprising the balance sheet, operating statement, cash flow statement, statement of changes in equity and notes) of Hadia Medical Swiss for the financial year ended 31 December 2025. In accordance with Swiss GAAP FER 21, the disclosures in the performance report are not subject to the examination by the statutory auditor.

These financial statements in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER, the legal requirements and the articles of association are the responsibility of the Committee. Our responsibility is to perform a limited statutory examination on these financial statements. We confirm that we meet the licensing and independence requirements as stipulated by Swiss law.

We conducted our examination in accordance with the Swiss Standard on the Limited Statutory Examination. This standard requires that we plan and perform a limited statutory examination to identify material misstatements in the financial statements. A limited statutory examination consists primarily of inquiries of entity personnel and analytical procedures as well as detailed tests of entity documents as considered necessary in the circumstances. However, the testing of operational processes and the internal control system, as well as inquiries and further testing procedures to detect fraud or other legal violations, are not within the scope of this examination.

Based on our limited statutory examination, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not give a true and fair view of the financial position, the results of operations and the cash flows in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER and do not comply with Swiss law and the articles of association.

We draw your attention to the fact that the General Meeting has not taken place within six months after the balance sheet date as required by Art. 958 para. 3 Swiss CO.
