Foreword by Dr Patrick Imahorn

Member of the Board of Directors, Hadia

In September 2021, a former fellow student from the University of Basel asked me if I could imagine getting involved with a Swiss NGO. This association, called Hadia Swiss Medical, is active in humanitarian work in East Africa and would welcome an expansion of its team in the field of medicine/paediatrics.

As the former head of a paediatric emergency department at a large Swiss children's hospital and as deputy chief physician in the organisational and administrative area, I unfortunately had no experience in development cooperation until now. On the other hand, I have always followed the political and social world with great interest and have already been involved in several social institutions in Switzerland.

However, I also saw the great need for development support in the medical/-infrastructure sector. My interest was piqued, and after doing some research on Somaliland and the Hadia association, I decided to join Hadia after an initial meeting with the association's management.

In autumn 2022, I set foot in Somaliland for the first time on a Hadia mission and was immediately impressed by the open, warm nature of the East African population. However, I also realised that there was a great need for development aid in the areas of medicine and infrastructure. At the same time, I noticed the many NGOs that wanted to provide the country with rapid but unsustainable support in the old "colonial" way. This controversy made me rather thoughtful.

I was even more impressed by Hadia Switzerland's support philosophy, which clearly delegated leadership to the local population and authorities. Hadia acts as a trainer, advisor and (financial) supporter, while the development directives and project responsibility are taken on by a Somaliland NGO called 'EDO' (Excellence Development Organisation), which was founded specifically for this purpose. The focus is on sustainability and must be in line with the ideas of the Somaliland government and population.

This approach fascinates me and points to a new path in development cooperation. And so I have now joined the Hadia board and am looking forward to continuing development work in the rural region of Salahley, where a new vision based on the "One Health" concept is to be created in a less developed border area between Somaliland and Ethiopia; all under the leadership of the EDO, in cooperation with the government and Hadia's Swiss partners.

Concept of cooperation and area of application

Hadia Medical Swiss focuses its activities on Somaliland on the Gulf of Aden. Project evaluation is based on the needs of the Somalilanders. They founded an NGO under Somaliland law, the Excellence Development Organisation (EDO), in which all relevant clans are represented. This gives us broad, solid support from the government and the key forces in Somaliland society.

Following activities at the Gabiley Regional Hospital, school construction in Bali-mataan and at the Edna Adan University Hospital in Hargeisa, Hadia Medical is supporting the development of healthcare (Global Health) in the Salahley area on the border with Ethiopia, starting with the construction of the regional hospital in Salahley.

The nomadic population of this region belongs to the Isaac clan family and lives in Somaliland or Ethiopia, depending on the availability of water and food. As there is no healthcare provision on the Ethiopian side of this area, most of the patients in Salahley come from Ethiopia.

Hadia addresses the needs of the government and local population, which are formulated and developed in round table discussions involving all stakeholders and joint project work. The EDO is responsible for the practical implementation on site, with Hadia providing support in the form of expertise and funding. The EDO has therefore also registered as an NGO in Ethiopia. Hadia itself will not do so. However, it should be noted that this cross-border project work serves to promote peace between Somalilanders and Ethiopians. Peace, in turn, is the foundation of all sustainable development.



Hadia supports the EDO in the actual project work involved in planning and implementation. This includes the further development of hospitals, mother and child health stations and other improvements to healthcare in the Salahley area. The hospital is run by the Ministry of Health, which has set up a running board for this purpose, on which EDO representatives also sit. Hadia is not involved in the running of the hospital in any way, nor does it pay any operating costs or wages.

Activities during the reporting year

The gynaecological training courses at Edna Adan Hospital continued. We also provided all the materials needed to renovate the sanitary facilities at the same hospital, which took place in early 2025. We also continued to provide financial support to a Somaliland medical student and the administrative director of Edna Adan University at Swiss TPH.

The main activity is the further development of the Salahley programme. Five representatives from Somaliland and from the Swiss institutions involved – Hadia, AN-NYA Foundation, Siteco and University Hospital Basel – took part in a workshop at the beginning of March. The participants approved the concept and its phased implementation.



At the Salahley Regional Hospital, we installed energy, drinking water and waste facilities to provide the infrastructure for orderly hospital operations. This also included the purchase of a tanker truck for water transport. The Somalilanders supplied the materials on very favourable terms (business discounts) and carried out essential repair work and improvements at their own expense, to a far greater extent than we could have expected. The main work was carried out during a mission by Hadia representatives together with the EDO in June. Some adjustments were made in 2025. In autumn, two representatives of the EDO visited Switzerland again, where we prepared for the reopening of the hospital in Salahley in several workshops.

Our partner AN-NYA carried out a surgical mission, which included operations and simultaneous training of personnel to be deployed in Salahley.

Phase 1, involving infrastructure work, was completed in the reporting year, with only minor details remaining. Preparations are in full swing for phase 2, which involves the commissioning of the maternity ward and an operating theatre for simpler operations. This took place in January 2025.

Report of the statutory auditor on the limited statutory examination in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER

As statutory auditor, we have examined the financial statements (comprising the balance sheet, operating statement, cash flow statement, statement of changes in equity and notes) of Hadia Medical Swiss for the financial year ended 31 December 2024. In accordance with Swiss GAAP FER 21, the disclosures in the performance report are not subject to the examination by the statutory auditor.

These financial statements in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER, the legal requirements and the articles of association are the responsibility of the Committee. Our responsibility is to perform a limited statutory examination on these financial statements. We confirm that we meet the licensing and independence requirements as stipulated by Swiss law.

We conducted our examination in accordance with the Swiss Standard on the Limited Statutory Examination. This standard requires that we plan and perform a limited statutory examination to identify material misstatements in the financial statements. A limited statutory examination consists primarily of inquiries of entity personnel and analytical procedures as well as detailed tests of entity documents as considered necessary in the circumstances. However, the testing of operational processes and the internal control system, as well as inquiries and further testing procedures to detect fraud or other legal violations, are not within the scope of this examination.

Based on our limited statutory examination, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not give a true and fair view of the financial position, the results of operations and the cash flows in accordance with Swiss GAAP FER and do not comply with Swiss law and the articles of association.

We draw your attention to the fact that the General Meeting has not taken place within six months after the balance sheet date as required by Art. 958 para. 3 Swiss CO.
